Out of that study came the creation of the daycare in the basement of the Church. Next, the group focused on the needs of seniors and the Project known as “Unitarian House” was established.

March 27th, 1983 was a significant date in our history. On this day, the “Sod Turning” for our “Home” took place and our success story began.

Unitarian House continues to be a “Role Model” as Ottawa’s not-for-profit Retirement Residence and Senior Apartments. We believe that “Home” is a safe place where you are accepted as you are and free to be your best self.

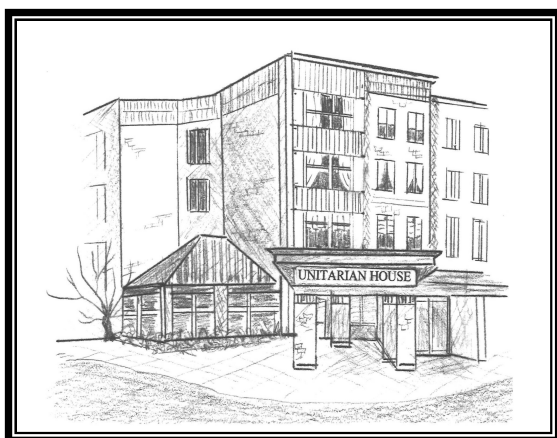
Welcome!
