## Calendar Girl

What is this story about? Why the title? Think *Calendar Girls*, the 2003 movie starring Helen Mirren, about a Women's Institute fundraising for a local hospital by posing nude for a calendar, which went viral. Now think Unitarian House going one better, with calendar girls, and boys, ages 70-plus, 80-plus and up to 99 posing for our own fundraising calendar - much to the shock and horror of some of their offspring. But. They. Just. Don't. Care.



Our calendar story begins with Alice Bushe, Unitarian House resident and go-getter, sitting at Happy Hour

one day in 2012 wondering how to shake things up around here. There were two things on her mind: how to help our most long-lived residents facing financial hardship remain here; and what to do for some fun. Putting the two together, the idea for a "naked truth" calendar took shape. After getting buy-in from management and residents willing to pose, Alice set about getting the calendar produced on a shoestring, within seven months. For all that, the 2014 calendar was a roaring success, raising \$15,000 for the Financial Assistance Program. Despite the many laughs involved in the production, as well as a few unforeseen challenges, Alice vowed never again and said the experience was "like herding cats."

However, ensuring that no-one has to leave Unitarian House at the end of their life because of money is of constant concern, and Alice, along with many others are always on the lookout for ways to fund the Program. So, in 2018, Christina O'Neil, Executive Director, asked Alice what she thought about doing another calendar. With plenty of lead time and a very supportive staff at Unitarian House lending expertise in communications, publicity and technical skills, Alice decided to do it all again.

When "The Naked Truth 2020 Calendar-Sports Revealed" proposal was put to the Residents' Association, the response was overwhelmingly in favour; before the meeting's



end, Alice had all the photo models she needed. Here's what resident Lynn Collins had to say: "The minute I heard, I knew I wanted to be in the calendar because it sounded like so much fun." With an accomplished volunteer photographer, Diane Russon, already on

board, a designated space on the 4th floor blocked off, and a workable schedule, the photo shoots began. As well as in-house space, four off-site venues were sourced: a boxing gym, a swimming pool, a climbing wall, and the YMCA/YWCA. Everyone who was

approached, whether to use their facilities or to borrow sports equipment, was very enthusiastic and



supportive of the project. All went according to plan, the photo shoots are all done, and it only remains to choose the best for the calendar. The photos in this article are just a glimpse of what is to come.

With phase one completed and the calendar due to be printed in August 2019, the next hurdles are the printing/production costs, which is where the rest of us come in. You will have the option to pre-order a calendar at a reduced price, which is one very effective way to help achieve our goal. Or, if you prefer, you can make a contribution to help fund the production costs.
